Also see the places you've been to?



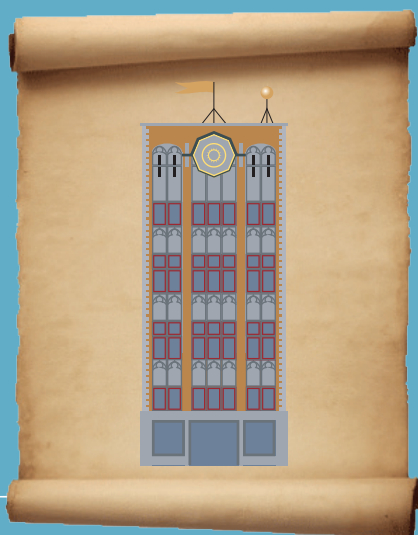
What doesn't belong in the chest?
