- is the centre of the city administration where the aldermen and tribunals sat.
- is a former inn and hotel after the family of the same name which slowly grew into a centre for the commercial world through the presence of many traders.
- is the meeting room of the bourgeoisie where many political decisions and agreements were informally concluded and lobbied.


